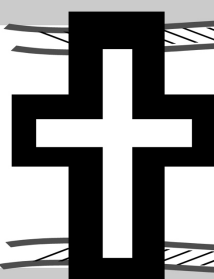

Sister Sez....

Read Matthew 25:31-46.

Does Jesus see the corporal works of mercy as something strictly for “religious” people? Does Jesus see our works of

mercy mattering only if we do them for “religious” people? **And the Answer:** Jesus insists that we care for the “least one” of society. The Kingdom of God is found in reaching out to the “other” in love (i.e. willing the good of the other as other). The divine life that all the saint’s share in, is in giving themselves away. This is not an abstract principle, but something very concrete. The corporal and spiritual works of mercy of the concrete means all persons must use in order to enter the Kingdom of God. They are not only for “religious” people nor are they to be done only to “religious” people, for the end of all human beings is the Kingdom of God, but that spiritual state is only given if these concrete actions are taken and done for all persons.
