Pastor's Column

IS IT ETHICAL?

One would hope so, whatever it is you're doing, especially at a hospital. That's why many health care institutions have ethical committees, including Geisinger Lewistown Hospital (GLH).

Ethics is roughly synonymous with morality, i.e., carrying out actions that are compatible with respect for the human person and his or her environment. A hospital ethical committee would, therefore, suggest to hospital administration certain policies for medical procedures that guard both patient and caregiver dignity. Assuring informed consent for patients before they undergo surgery would be an example. Another might be protecting a physician's right to decline to do a procedure that he or she considers immoral.

Most ethical committees are consultative, with administrators making final decisions on policies. But committee members might also be available to advise medical personnel, patients or families on individual cases.

I have served on the Lewistown committee about two years now and today we were visited by Daniel Davis, PhD, Director of Bioethics for Geisinger Health System, Danville. He is formerly associated with Georgetown University, Washington, D.C., and he spoke to us on the future of the GLH committee and its changing nature in upcoming years.

First of all, we have a vibrant future, one that will see the importance of ethical committees increasing as medical moral issues continue to evolve and challenge both patients and medical personnel alike. He said that he hoped all of the "platforms," i.e., hospitals in the Geisinger system, would have ethical committees.

In the past two years, the Lewistown committee has advised on policies regarding advanced directives for patients (orders that patients write as to what medical measures they want taken or not taken when they are near death), power of attorney (a document stating who will make medical decision for the patient if he or she is unable), and POLST (Pennsylvania Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment).

Dr. Davis said that one big change coming is training and certification for ethical committee members who are available for consults on emergency cases, although he specified that not all committee members would need such extended education.

Dr. Davis also said that the various "platform" ethical committees, such as ours at Lewistown, would keep their autonomy. There would be no "central committee" at Danville, to which the other committees must report. He said that he is available to advise the various committees in the system and to attend their meetings.

The dialogue opened up new vistas as to what a hospital ethical committee can do. With our work definitely cut out for us, we will see what the future holds. **Fr. Bill**


